

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board

The Meeting was brought to order by Chair, Randall Iserman, at 6:06pm, and a quorum was found present.

Motion to approve November 19, 2020 meeting minutes

Trustee Blankfein motioned, trustee Falkner seconded
 November meeting minutes approved by unanimous vote

Motion to add Peter Sack to the board of trustees

Trustee Osse motioned, trustee Blankfein seconded
 Petter Sack added to the board by unanimous vote

• Financial committee presentation:

- Update on new CFO service provider
- Headcount goal: 270 students for 2020-2021
- Even with a headcount of 258 students, we'd still arrive of a net surplus of \$80K;
 offset by a higher number of special ed students; also aided by no expenses for food service
- Current budget is based on headcount of 262.4
- We still have a covid contingency plan of \$134K in the amended budget
- If we don't use this contingency money, our surplus will increase, dollar-for-dollar
- Discussion around state funding: Changes for Per pupil funding would need to be, legislatively
- Approval of new budget
 - Trustee Murphy motioned, trustee Falkner seconded
 New budget is approved by unanimous voice vote

• Strategic planning Committee report:

- Consultant said the work the school leadership and board had done for school branding obviated a lot of questions
- Facilities were a major sticking point; elevators, specifically
- Admissions was the other issue: getting 6th graders who were all in a better place, academically



- We started to talk about merger with potential K-5 schools
 - School in Brooklyn. Sticking/stopping point: Logistics issues, lease
 - We're speaking with administrators at two of those schools in lower
 Manhattan
 - Conversations so far had been about fit
 - No talk about merger
 - These schools have excess space
 - It would enable us to move the 6th grade out and have fewer students in the same space. Which would help with overcrowding
 - Student, and faculty satisfaction and concerns have to be a part of decision process
 - We want to make sure that the other entities are interested in having an arts-based education
 - This could be a two year process
 - Could be completed in 2023 by the time the merger is Oked

• School Leadership Report

- Since the remote program is successful, CSA shifting to reopening 3/22/21
- Winter MAP testing 1/28 1/29/21
- We're doing grouping to make sure that we're giving extra support to students with IEPs
- In Advisory, teachers are explaining the importance of the tests so that students have more invested in their progress
- Attendance progress and completion: % of seen students increased to 97.59%
- No homework being assigned. There's double blocks of reading/writing in school.
 Students are completing their assignments in school
- Started student support groups. Each adult is responsible for 2-3 students. And they communicate with parents
 - Attendance in small groups is now being taken
 - Composition of small groups is based on MAP scores
- Willow and Desieree writing Responsive Classroom curriculum and Advisory
- SUNY asked: How will we determine quantitatively if the school is successful? What are departmental goals?
- Academic achievement goals: SUNY appreciated the goals
- Create, Learn, Thrive works in a cycle
 - Create team: translating arts team to a remote model
 - Learn team: using data to inform decisions. using data to talk about academics and attendance. And to note when interventions are made
 - There wasn't as much professional development as much as Elisa wanted. She is having more of these, including differentiation



- Thrive has 2 components:
 - Advisory
 - A system where teachers can visit other teachers' Advisories
- Race and equity work: internal committee that would work together and they have conversations and meets regularly
 - The goal is to bring someone in to do this work with teachers
- Student Recruitment update
 - Enrollment, no losses since last meeting
 - Recruitment being led by WIllow and Desiree
 - There's a media kit created with media and video
 - We're reaching out to parents who might be unhappy with their current schools and doing outreach to areas where we have clusters of families
 - Leveraging existing families
 - Half of enrolled students found out about CSA by word of mouth
